Replying to yours of recent date. I'm sorry I can give you very little information in regard to my father Albert Strapp as he died away from home when I was a small child. I dont even rember having seen him. He was a member of the mormon betalion that went to fight in the American mexican conflict. His name is carved on the monument on the Mtah State capitol grounds as one of the members as to my self: Born January 23, 1859 in Farmington, Mario bo. Mtah my mothers name was fudith briatt Strapp. She married J. Willox as wife ho. 2 and I was unable to stand the abuse that was heaped upon me by him and his first wifes family so I left home with only the clothes I stood up in and without a cent in my pocket to seek my fortune. I obtained employment in verious places during the summer seasons

and lived with an uncle during the binter weather where I earned my board and lodgings helping him in the blacksmith shop. In my early manhood I became a contractor furnished the valley smelters with Line and Linestone 35 car loads a week used then for fluxing I also furnished foundation stone for some of the largest buildings of the day then being built. Later on I became interested in mining, by hard knocks learned the business, took a course in metal mining from the International borispondence schools of Beranton Penn. My course included Heology, Assaying, Surveying, Milling Ore dressing & &.

I became a mining expert Geologist and mining engineer and managed mines for others. It hile managing to mine at Golden, her mais my health failed, went under an operation for gland trouble, event under three more operations for same trouble in the last four years and my health is so bad I had to retire from all activities. I was married to may bummings in the year 1885 we had a boy and a girl, the boy died when four days old in convut -

sions the girl died in her seventeenth year of pneumonia, I down divorced my wife in 1892 and married miss Sari Hutchings in 1901. We have no children, We are both in poor health I have a poor memory and can't think of anything more that might interest you so will close Sincerely syours Willin
